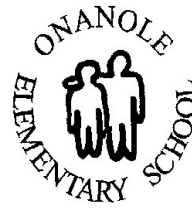

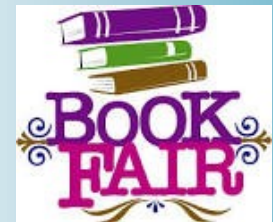

KINDERGARTEN NEWS

This week is a very short week for our class, we only have one day to learn and play. I'm so happy to report that all of the Early Years Evaluation "EYE" assessments are complete and the students are right on track. The reports will be shared in lieu of the regular RRSD report cards. I look forward to sharing the results with you.

The students are getting closer to completing their letter of the day and will be getting ready to read. To do so, we start by noticing and playing with the words, rhymes and syllables they hear in everyday speech. This is called phonological awareness. We are also working on the individual sounds of letter or phonemes in words. This is called phonemic awareness. These pre-reading skills are essential for the challenge of reading.

A good way to help your child develop phonemic awareness is to read aloud to your child frequently. Choose books that rhyme or repeat the same sound. Draw your child's attention to rhymes: "Fox, socks, box! Those words all rhyme. Do you hear how they almost sound the same?" It also helps to point out repeated sounds. For example, if you're reading *One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish*, ask your child to listen to the /fffff/ sound in fish. (Really stretch the sounds out at first.) Outside of story time, try pointing out other words that start with the /fffff/ sound, just like in the book.

Playing with words and sounds should be fun. Make a game of it like "I spy with my little eye something that starts with /fffff/".

Siblings are also great teachers when it comes to pre-reading activities and this can be good reminders for their own skills. When you bring awareness to how words connect and breaking words apart in a fun way, everyone benefits.

Grade 1/2

In literacy we continue to work on reading in small groups. We talk about reading strategies to use when we come across a word we don't know. Grade 2's have been working on the "silent e" spelling rule. Grade 1's have been working on composing sentences with a capital and period. In math we continue to work on representing through tallies, ten frames, addition and subtraction facts. Grade 2's have started working on estimating objects by using grouping strategies and Grade 1's have started some basic addition facts to 10 and ordering numbers to 20.

In our social science class, we wrapped up talking about November 11th and the importance of Remembrance Day. We continue to talk about daily and seasonal changes and the affects it has on human, animal and plant life.

Parent Teacher interviews will be on the evening of Thursday, November 21st and the morning of the November 22nd. A schedule of your interview times will be emailed out by next week, so keep an eye out.
