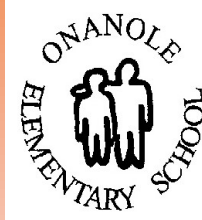

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Due to Covid-19 restrictions, changes will be made to our annual Halloween activities at Onanole School. These procedures are in line with recommendations put forward by the Government of Manitoba: (Please see website link below) <https://www.gov.mb.ca/covid19/updates/holidays.html>

- Halloween activities will take place on Friday, Oct. 30. The Kindergarten will have their Halloween on Thursday, Oct 29th
- Individual classrooms may plan activities during the day, based on teacher discretion (more information to follow from individual classroom teachers).
- There will not be any “pot luck” activities or “home-made” treats/food for sharing. Halloween treats that come to school must be in pre-packaged form.

- Younger students must be able to put on their costumes independently Students can wear their costumes all day to avoid needing to get dressed up at school.

- For students in grades 4-8, a mask must be worn as per Covid guidelines, regardless of the costume.

- The traditional Halloween parade will take place virtually on Teams or outdoors if weather permits and public health guidelines allow.

- Reminder that No Gruesome or graphic costumes should be worn and no weapons can be brought to school to accompany costumes.

We are aware that this is not the Halloween that we have had in the past but we will continue to ensure that safety for staff and students remains a priority and we will make the very best with what we are able to do this year.

In literacy, the grade 1/2 classroom have been working on finding the nouns and verbs in sentences. We are also working on identifying complete and incomplete sentences. The grade 1s have been working with vowels and the sounds they make. They are learning that every word needs a vowel. Grade 2s are working on long vowel sounds and the "silent e" rule.

In math, we are working on counting to 100 by 5s through song and dance. The grade 2s are teaching the grade 1s how to play "I Have Who Has". We are wrapping up our unit on representing numbers. Grade 1s have been working lots with tally marks and ten frames while the grade 2s are working on place value.
