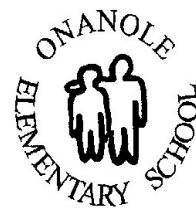

As we begin November, the focus will be on the Early Years Evaluation. This assessment will be used for our November report cards. The focus is on these five areas: Awareness of Self and Environment, Social Skills and Approaches to Learning, Cognitive Skills, Language and Communication and Physical Development. The purpose of this assessment is to gain insight into how the students think, learn, and make sense of their world. This information helps me to create programming that builds on their natural curiosity, ideas, and abilities. I look forward to sharing their growth with you at the end of the month.



1st

2nd GRADE

I hope everyone had a good Halloween weekend! In literacy, grade 1s continue to work at constructing a proper sentence that starts with a capital and ends with a period. Grade 1s are still working on vowel sounds and are beginning to learn letter digraphs such as sh, ch, th. Grade 2s are working on the “bossy ‘r’ rule” that include vowel digraphs such as ar, or, ir, ur, and er. This week we will start talking about adding suffixes to words such as “ing”, “ed” and “s”.

In math this week, grade 1s are working on basic addition facts to 10. We are also working on doubles to 12. Grade 2s are working on comparing and ordering numbers to 100. We are also discussing place value.

We will be starting our new Social studies unit this week as we discuss our community. We will talk about what defines a community. We will discuss some of the services our community offers. We will also be talking about and exploring some of the natural resources in our community verses the man-made products.

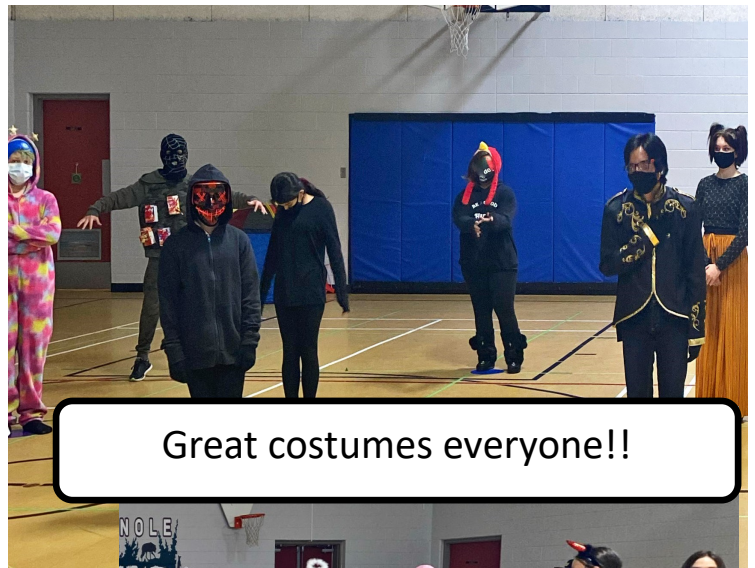
Grade 7/8
