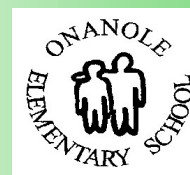

I hope everyone enjoyed their Spring Break!

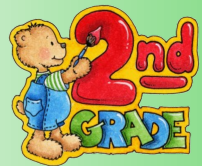
