Math 8: final quiz Wednesday May 18 on cylinders before moving onto our last unit on Per Cents

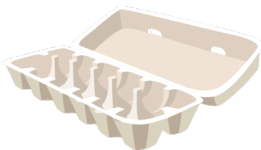
Social Studies: discussing the Rights of the Child and access to Education around the world before beginning a large inquiry project on a world injustice
